He sold his ware at many stores and tourist sites and displayed prolifically at craft fairs and bazaars.

Nick was friendly and sociable, inviting people, on his Facebook page, to "call or text anytime". He named his business "NIXAVL". He described his work as "Lightweight, colorful pottery bowls and mugs". He taught classes and organized "Pot Parties" to spread the joy.
